Charminar

Sultan Muhammad Quli Qutub Shah, the 5th ruler of the Qutub Shahi dynasty built Charminar in 1591 shortly after he had shifted his capital from Golkonda to what is now known as Hyderabad.

The Salarjung Museum is the third largest museum in India housing the biggest one-man collection of antiques in the world.



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
